

ORDINANCE 89-2

An Ordinance requiring the Owners of all pets within the Limits of Town of Silver Lake, Kosciusko County, State of Indiana, to restrain them from running at large.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Silver Lake, Kosciusko County, State of Indiana, that the owner or keeper of any pet or pets within the limits of the Town of Silver Lake is hereby required to restrain them from running at large, upon any street, alley, sidewalk, public place, public grounds, and personal property, within the limits of said Town.

Section 2. That it shall be unlawful for any person being the owner or keeper of any pet to permit such pet or pets to trespass upon the property of any person within the limits of the Town of Silver Lake, to the annoyance of such person.

Section 3. That any vicious or ferocious animal is not to be kept in the community, regardless of whether or not it is on a chain.

Section 4. That the Town Marshal or any other police officer is hereby instructed to strictly enforce each and all of the provisions of this Ordinance. And He or They are empowered and authorized to arrest any and all persons found in violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance. And said Marshal and other Police Officer of said Town are hereby authorized to take into custody, and to dispose of, any pet running at large or in violation of this Ordinance, in any manner.

Section 5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall upon conviction, be fined not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for each and every conviction.

Unconstitutionality Clause:

Should any section, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason the remainder of said Ordinance shall not be affected hereby.

REpeal: All Ordinance or parts of Ordinance in conflicts with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
